Through these panels you can "virtually visit" the places where the miracles happened.



"My life plan is to always be connected to Jesus". With these few
words, Carlo Acutis, who died of
leukaemia when he was only fifteen
years old, outlined the distinctive feature of his brief existence: living with
Jesus, for Jesus and in Jesus".
To quote Carlo's own words: "Our
destination must be what is infinite,
not what is finite. Infinity is our homeland. We have been expected in
Heaven since time immemorial".
He also said: "All are born with their
own originality, but many die as
photocopies".

In the entire history of the Catholic Church, there have been numerous Eucharistic miracles approved by the Catholic Church as truly worthy of belief. The Vatican Eucharistic Miracles Photographic Exhibition faithfully recounts for us many well documented miraculous occurrences. Knowledge of these miracles strengthens our faith in Christ and His Church. They are visible proof of Jesus Christ's Real Presence in the Holy Eucharist. The Exhibit was created by Blessed Carlo Acutis, a 15 year old from Milan, Italy who was Beatified on October 10, 2020.
